 - The Knowledge Academy District Administrator will need to send an email invitation to all staff who need access; once that happens, each staff member will receive a Knowledge Academy invitation they can use to create their account.

If you DO know your Knowledge Academy account information

1. Log in at KnowledgeAcademy.NWEA.org
2. Click on “Learning Library” at the top.
3. Click on the “Title” column to sort alphabetically.
4. Look up the learning resource you need by its title.





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
